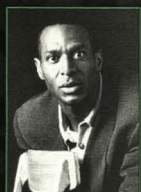

Change is happening in the South Greenwich area.

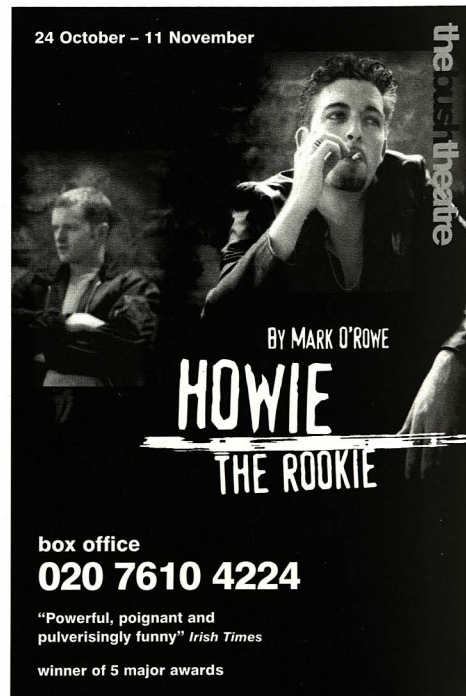

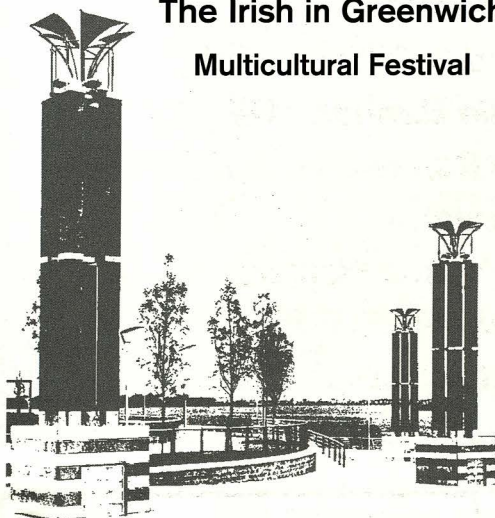

Woolwich Revival is the seven year, £140 million programme to revitalise Woolwich.

Some of our achievements so far include:

Arsenal Gardens

A large riverside site has been transformed with a stylish landscaped park. From the main entrance on Warren Lane a terrace gently slopes down to a raised riverside walkway along the Thames.

It is hoped that the opening of the park will mark a new era for Woolwich with the future opening up of the Royal Arsenal site and a new leisure development featuring a multiplex cinema, restaurants and bars on the adjacent site.

Royal Artillery Museum

The Royal Artillery Museum (RAM) project plays a pivotal role not only within the development of the Royal Arsenal Site but in relation to the commercial development of the Woolwich area, particularly in establishing a local tourism economy with positive effects on employment.

Royal Artillery Museums Limited proposes to open RAM by Spring 2001. Using exceptional design and robust exhibition technology the visitor will feel part of the experience when presented with the story of artillery and regiment.

Greenwich Heritage Centre

The Council is to co-locate the Greenwich Heritage Centre within the RAM complex of Buildings at the Royal Arsenal.

Cardwell Estate

The Cardwell estate, located in St Mary's ward of Woolwich has undergone a rigorous regeneration programme. It is one of the flagship projects of the SRB1 'Woolwich Revival Programme' with £6m of SRB funds being used. The project consisted of demolition, new build and refurbishment works and has seen 151 new properties coming into existence.

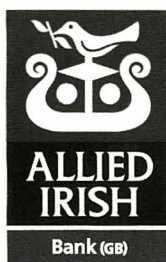
