Sincere thanks go to Paddy Lennon of Patrick Lennon Associates for his special contribution to the organisation of tonight's Awards Ceremony.

The Irish Post Awards were launched in the mid-seventies. Their purpose was and remains to applaud personal achievement which redounds to the credit of the Irish community in Britain and also to highlight community service by Irish people and organisations. In short, they are a celebration of Irish achievement in this country, a toast to the concept of being Irish abroad.

The awards are made annually. This evening's presentation dinner is the seventeenth.

Many distinguished figures have previously been among the recipients. In the performing arts, for instance, there have been Kenneth Branagh, Peter O'Toole, Fiona Shaw, Daniel Day-Lewis, Michael Gambon, Stephen Rea and Cyril Cusack, as well as his daughters Sinead and Niamh.

Dame Ninette de Valois, that great lady of ballet, was a recipient in the early eighties and on the occasion of the presentation recalled dancing as a young girl in her native Wicklow.

There have been figures too from other areas of entertainment — Bob Geldof, Mary O'Hara, the distinguished stage designer Bob Crowley, the director Declan Donnellan and the broadcaster Desmond Lynam.

Among the writers honoured have been William Trevor, Edna O'Brien, Jerry O'Neill, Shane Connaughton, Bernard Mac Laverty, Anne Devlin, Donall Mac Amhlaigh, Desmond Hogan and the historian Roy Foster.

Professor Anthony Clare, probably the best known psychiatrist in these islands, was a recipient in the eighties. So too in previous years were distinguished academic figures like Professor James O'Connell, Professor Mike Cooley and Professor Hugh Maguire.

But most of the awards have actually gone over the years to Irish community activists and organisations. The organisations have ranged from the McLaughlin School of Irish Dancing in Glasgow to Leeds Comhaltas, from the Liverpool Irish Centre to Plumkett House in Birmingham and the Brent Irish Advisory Centre in London. Honoured too have been the Irish Chaplaincy and individual religious who have made unique contributions to society in a range of ways, among them Sister Annuciata, Fr. Brian Lawlor and the late Monsignor Patrick O'Mahony.

What all the recipients, in their diverse ways, have shared is their achievement in enriching Irish community life in Britain and making a unique contribution to the host society.





OUR WORK IN IRELAND

What Do We Do?

Through our parent organisation — Co-operation North, we bring people together at their points of common interest, across community divides and across the border.

We help whittle away the barriers of fear and mistrust.

We enable people to see that the things we share far outweigh the things that divide us.

We create the mechanisms whereby thousands of people, mostly young, can meet, work together and explore in a structured and supported way, the issues and attitudes which divide them.

We act as a catalyst to encourage other key organisations to adopt a similar approach —possibly by using Co-operation North as a facilitator under which they can make the first tentative moves.

Although non-political, we assist the political process by creating a climate conducive to contact and dialogue.

Co-operation North's main activities are divided into five programme areas:

- The Youth, Education and Community Programme brings together thousands of young people and adults from both nationalist and unionist traditions in a wide range of cross-border and cross-community exchange programmes.
- The Economic Co-operation Programme publishes research on common economic and social problems and promotes cross-community and cross-border links between local community/enterprise groups.
- The Cultural Traditions Programme works to achieve a shared appreciation of the diversity of traditions and cultural heritage on the island of Ireland. The programme stimulates debate through conferences, local authority twinnings and cultural exchanges.
- The Media Programme focuses on stimulating media debate about how inter-community and cross-border events and issues are reported and seeks to create networks and information exchanges between journalists North and South.
- **Special and Fundraising Events** such as the Maracycle are organised during the year. They are designed to encourage thousands of people to participate in cross-border fun events and to raise funds for the organisation. Up to 20,000 people are directly involved in Co-operation North's programmes annually.


