

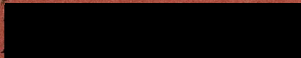

AN CUMANN GAEDÉALACH

R I A Š A L A C A

1. The Club shall be known as AN CUMANN GAEDÉALACH and Membership shall be open to persons of Irish birth or descent. Others may be admitted to membership at the discretion of the Committee.

2. The objects of the Club shall be: To provide a social centre for Irish people in London and to preserve and advance Irish culture, i.e., Language, Dancing, Music, Literature, Drama, etc.

3. The Club shall be non-political and non-sectarian and no political questions of any kind shall be raised at its meetings.

4. Members of Cu-Chulain Football and Hurling Club, and Cu-Chulain Camogie Club shall be eligible for full membership. Only full members eligible for Committee.

5. The Club shall be controlled by a committee consisting of five officers, i.e., Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Hon. Secretary, Treasurer, Hon. Registrar, and five members who shall be appointed at the Annual General Meeting. The Committee shall have power to co-opt further members to the number of three if considered necessary. All vacancies to be filled by co-option.

6. The annual subscription shall be One Shilling (1/-) which must be paid on application for membership and at the beginning of each year.

7. The Annual Meeting shall be held in JANUARY of each year and notification must be sent to all members. The Secretary's report and the Balance Sheet shall be read at this meeting. The election shall be by ballot and in the event of a tie, the Chairman must give his casting vote.

8. At all functions organised by An Cumann Gaedealach only dances defined by the Irish Dancing Commission shall be permitted.

9. The Committee shall reserve the right to refuse any application for membership or to expel or exclude from the Club any member who misbehaves in any way or who refuses to conform to the Club rules.

10. A Special General Meeting of the Club may be held at any time at the request of the Committee. Five days' notice of such meeting must be sent to all members.

11. An Extraordinary General Meeting of the Club may be held at any time at the written request of 20 members of the Club. Five days' notice must be sent to all members and only the business for which the meeting is called shall be discussed at such meeting.

12. Amendments or alterations to these rules can only be made at an Annual General Meeting, and to come into effect one year after that date. Any alteration must have in its favour a majority of those present.
