


# A MESSAGE FROM CARDINAL HUME

One of four talented sisters, well known in Ireland, Eily O'Grady gave her first radio broadcast as a pianist at the age of eight. She studied piano with Elizabeth Huban in Dublin and after winning many awards at the Dublin Feis Ceoil she obtained a scholarship from the Italian Government and went to Rome where she studied for four years with Carlo Zecchi.

With her husband, Frank Patterson, Eily has given many recitals in the U.S.A., Canada and Europe. She appears frequently on Radio and Television.

An accomplished exponent of our native instrument — the Irish Harp, Eily studied with Nancy Calthorpe, the well known teacher and arranger of Irish Folk Music.

#### NA CASAIDIGH

Na Casaidigh are one of the most exciting young traditional Groups in Ireland to-day. Five brothers, originally from the Donegal Gaeltacht, they have won competitions both in the traditional and classical field and each boy plays several instruments. They come from a great family tradition and their father, Sean O Casaide is a distinguished scholar of Irish Music and Literature. Already, Na Casaidigh have toured France and Wales and have appeared on B.B.C., and R.T.E. television.




#### MICHAEL TWOMEY

Michael Twomey is a most versatile and distinguished actor. Born in Cork, he began his career as a Shakespearean actor and was particularly noted for his portrayal of Hamlet, for which he won "Best Actor" award at the Killarney Festival, 1959.



#### FRANK PATTERSON

Frank Patterson is one of Ireland's foremost International artistes. Born in Clonmel, Co. Tipperary, he made his first public appearance as a boy-soprano his hometown. In 1962. commenced vocal studies with Dr. Hans Waldemar Rosen, pursuing at the same time a course of acting at the National Academy of Theatre and Allied Arts in Dublin. Two years later, he won all the major vocal awards at the Dublin Feis Ceoil (Ireland's National Music Festival). Scholarships to London and Holland followed and he finally went to Paris, where he studied for four years with the famous French soprano, Janine Michaeu. To help finance his studies during this period, he gave frequent concert, radio and television performances and it was a broadcast of Purcell Songs on B.B.C. (London) that first brought him to the attention of the Philips Record Company. While still a student in Paris, he signed a five year exclusive recording contract with them.

Now with eleven L.P.'s to his credit, he is much in demand throughout Europe for oratorio (his performances as the Evangelist in the Bach Passions have won particular praise), concert, recital, radio and television engagements and has already completed four coast-to-coast tours of the U.S.A. and Canada. He has sung with Colin Davis, Sir Charles Groves, Jean Fournet, Karl Richter and Paul Sacher, and has been soloist with many major orchestras including the London Symphony, Royal Philharmonic, Halle, Liverpool Philharmonic, Orchestre de



Paris, Rotterdam Philharmonic, Basel Chamber Orchestra, Academy of St. Martin in the Fields and R.A.I. Symphony of Rome.

Frank Patterson is married to the Irish pianist, Eily O'Grady, and when not on tour lives in Ireland, where he has his own Radio Series and regular television show "For your pleasure — Frank Patterson".

Last year, Frank had the great honour of being invited to sing "Panis Angelicus" at the Eucharistic Congress in Philadelphia. The first Irishman to be so honoured since John McCormack. He has just returned from an extensive Concert Tour of Holland and after his appearances in Britain, he leaves for concerts in Italy and Sicily.
