C. DESMOND GREAVES - A distinguished historian and author of "The Life and Times of James Connolly". Member of the Connolly Association and editor of "Irish Democrat".

STEVEN FIELDING - Currently completing a PhD at Warwick University on the Irish in Manchester 1890-1939. Member of Coventry IBRG.

MARY LENNON - Researching a book on the history of Irish women's emigration as part of Granuaile Collective. The book will be published by Virago in Spring 1988.

LIAM CLARKE - Lecturer in Social Work. Currently researching a PhD on the needs of the elderly and the workers who support them.

SISTER ANNA - Sister of Charity and member of Catholic Travelling Mission.

FRONTLINE-CULTURE AND EDUCATION - Manchester Theatre Group who work with young people. Their first production "A Struggle for Freedom" received wide acclaim. In December their play "No Irish Need Apply" will be performed in Manchester.
