Dear Member,



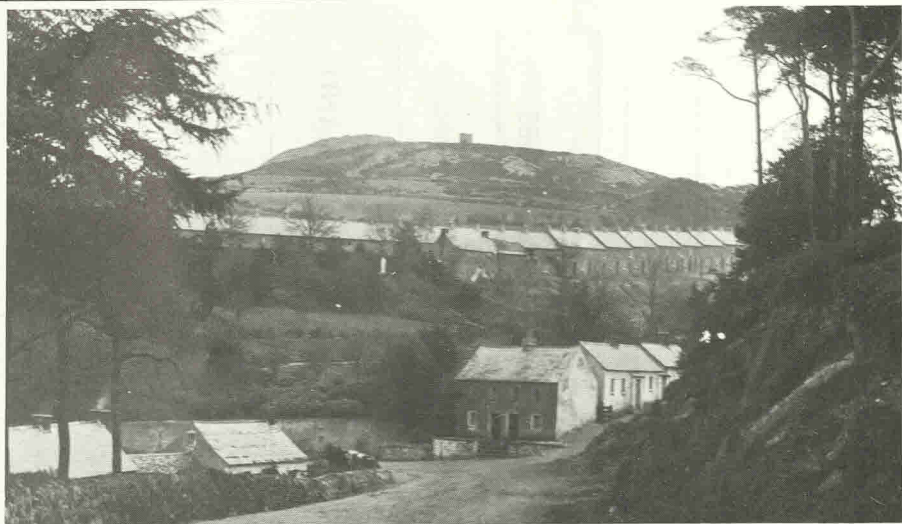
