

A Sense of Ireland

A Sense of Ireland is a major festival of the Irish Arts which takes place in over forty venues throughout London from the first weekend of February for six weeks. Events will include theatre, music, the visual arts, literature, film, design, photography, archaeology, architecture, dance, crafts and seminars. The scale and content of the event is such as to have the broadest possible appeal, and while Ireland's heritage is integral to the entire event the main emphasis will be on contemporary work

The purposes of the festival are to present the best of the Irish arts, North and South, in a major international context; to demonstrate in England the depth and strength of Ireland's heritage and contemporary culture; to make an important contribution to improving understanding and relations between the people of these islands.

A Sense of Ireland was initiated by London's institute of of Contemporary Arts and is now an independent body working with the support of the Cultural Relations Committee of the Irish Department of Foreign Affairs and of the Visiting Arts Unit of Great Britain, and with the advice of the two Arts Councils in Ireland.
