The Chairman opened the meeting, saying that as it was
a Saturday night, if there was no objection the reading of
the minutes could be deferred until next meeting. This was
agreed. The Chairman then reported that he & the Vice-Chairman
Mrs. P. Lynch had represented the Association at a meeting at
the Irish Centre. The purpose of which was to ask the help
of each Association in the form of a stall to be stocked
as ~~needed~~ manned at a Bazaar to be held at Cawdron in
Highgate on Sat 1st October. The Corkmen's Association decided on
a grocery stall. Three members Mrs. M. Murphy, Mrs. O'Sullivan &
Mr. W. O'Connell promised to man the stall from 1.0 o'clock. - would
draw the stall & put the groceries on it for 1.30 p.m. See

~ Mrs O'Sullivan promised to go & take groceries by 2-2-30 P.M. Because Mr. W. Corrigan could not be present he donated £2 towards the stocking of the stall.

Annual Dinner. The Sec reported that the total number of tickets out at present stood at 221. The Chairman informed the meeting that he had invited the Mayor & Mayoress of Cork & Mr. Foley Parliamentary Secretary & Mrs Foley to be his guests at the dinner and the meeting agreed that they would be seated at the top table. Mr. T. Wyse suggested that these four be guests of the Association. ~ the meeting agreed, but the chairman insisted that they remain his guests. The Chairman reported that the Bishop & Canon Roche would be arriving from Ireland on Tuesday 25th & would be present at our social at the Gresham on Wednesday 26th. The Chairman was to circulate the Irish Parishes of the Bishop in order that as many relatives of the parishioners as possible living in London Area ^{met the Bishop at} could attend the social. Mr. T. Wyse promised to write to Dan Nolan Editor of the "Corkman" to publicise the event still further. He also suggested that a small intimate dinner be arranged for the Bishop on Tuesday 25th at the Irish Club. The chairman reported that he would be entertaining the Bishop & local clergy at his Presbytery on Wed 26th & after ward he would conduct him to the Social. The chairman reported that the Galtymore was not available for a proposed dance it being booked up to Christmas. The Treasurer reported that St. Pancras Town Hall was likewise booked, but that the Leymore Hall would be available on the 14th & 21st November for the purpose of a concert. The seating capacity was 1,536. & there was room for another 392 standing. The cost of hire would be £65. This project was discussed at length & it was decided to engage several fine artists, Joe Lynch as M.C. Samo Duffy The Cavanagh Dancers, Larry McCahill Accordion Band, Louis Brown (Tenor) and the South London Papers to open the concert. Pending that all these were available. The total cost of artists was roughly estimated to £318 with a further sum to be paid for advertising. The chairman that he had

This idea was accepted unanimously & it was decided that the slides could be shown in the Irish Club followed by a Social Membership: Various ideas & suggestions were put forward with a view to increasing membership.
