REPORT

on the

THIRD MEETING

---

The third meeting of the Stamford Hill branch was held on Wednesday, May 3rd at the Servite Convent Hall at 8.30 p.m. About thirty were in attendance. The Entertainment sub-Committee of the Stamford Hill Branch reported that a Ceilidhe would be held on every Wednesday, free to members and their guests, and that a collection would be made at each Ceilidhe. The first Ceilidhe will be held on Wednesday next May 10th from 8 to 10.30 p.m. They were applying to the Convent for the use of a Radiogram to provide the music. Gaelic League Instructors would be present at each Ceilidhe and dances for the benefit of English members would also be held regularly.

The Treasurer reported that there were about 45 fully paid up members at Stamford Hill.

It was suggested by the Secretary that notification of all other Branch meetings should be sent to each branch so that there would be contact between branch members. It was suggested that the Tories and Conservatives should be given a chance of seeing the point of view of members as regards Partition in Ireland and the Secretary said he would invite members of the Junior Imperial

League to future meetings. The question of Conscription arose, one member suggested that there should be an Irish Volunteer Brigade attached to the Irish Army which would recruit support from young Irishmen in Britain. A resolution was passed condemning the Conscription of Irishmen in the Six Counties and stating further that until Partition is settled that the Anti-Partition of Ireland League should call upon all Irishmen not to consider Conscription in this country.

The next Meeting was fixed for May 31st.
