Project Activities

The Irish in Greenwich Project was set up in 1983 by a steering group of local Irish people in Greenwich. In 1985 the group succeeded in securing funding from Greenwich Council for two full time workers and since then has pursued a variety of work to enhance the profile and postition of the 20,000 Irish people in Greenwich. It is guided by a 12 person management committee, which is elected annually from members.

The Project has worked with schools and libraries, instigated an Irish Pensioners Association, worked with the Migrant Training Company on high tech courses for Irish young people, provided welfare advice, guidance and a wide variety of social and cultural activities. In short, the Project has beavered away over the past five years to bring all aspects of Irish cultural experience into different areas of activity within the Borough.
