SUBSIDIARY PUBLICATION SERIES

This series was devised to provide new introductions to texts published in the main series in which the original introductions needed updating in line with developments in the field since they were written. The new introductions are also envisaged as a means of making the texts more accessible to students and non-specialists by situating them within their literary genre and their historical context. However they are not intended to replace the original introductions but to supplement them. On the occasion of reprints of the original volumes the opportunity is taken to insert them with the original introduction as additional introductory material. The purpose of publishing them independently as a subsidiary series is to make them available to students and other interested readers who may not wish to acquire the relevant main series volume. In recent years the Subsidiary Series has been expanded to include the proceedings of annual seminars which the Society has established in order to provide a fuller consideration of certain key texts published in the main series than is possible within the limits of an introduction.
