A spokesman for W. II. Smith, the newsagency chain, has rejected a complaint made by Bernie Grant, the leader of Haringey Borough Council in north London, regarding the sale of anti-Irish books.

Bernie Grant wrote to W. II. Smith asking that it review its policy of stocking at branches throughout the the country books which denigrate Irish people.

He said that members of the hish community in Haringey are

"deeply offended" by such books as The Official Irish Joke Book and The Irish Kama Sutra being on sale in W. H. Smith shops. The managers of local W. H. Smith shops had been approached by members of the Irish community but to no avail. Haringey Council had then been asked to

take up the issue.

The council's ethnic minorities joint consultative committee the Issue and considered condemned the production and distribution of racist literature, with specific reference to "so-called" joke books, posters and called" joke books, posters and such which "belittle and ridicule Irish people and Irish culture'

have invited management of W. H. Smith to meet me to discuss the matter and the council's policy on racial equality in general. I find it very disturbing that such material should be on sale in Haringey, which has a large trish community", Cllr. Grant said.

But a spokesman for W. H. Smith has said that it does not believe in "acting as a censor".

'INSIDIOUS'

But Clir, Grant intends to continue pressing the matter. He said: "Racism against the Irish is just as insidious and evil as against any other ethnic group. The fact that its usual form is socalled jokes means that a lot of people might not take it as scriously as they should. Haringey Council is totally opposed to racism in all its forms and we shall be doing what we can to ensure that the sale of this offensive material stops".
