### TUBE TRAINS

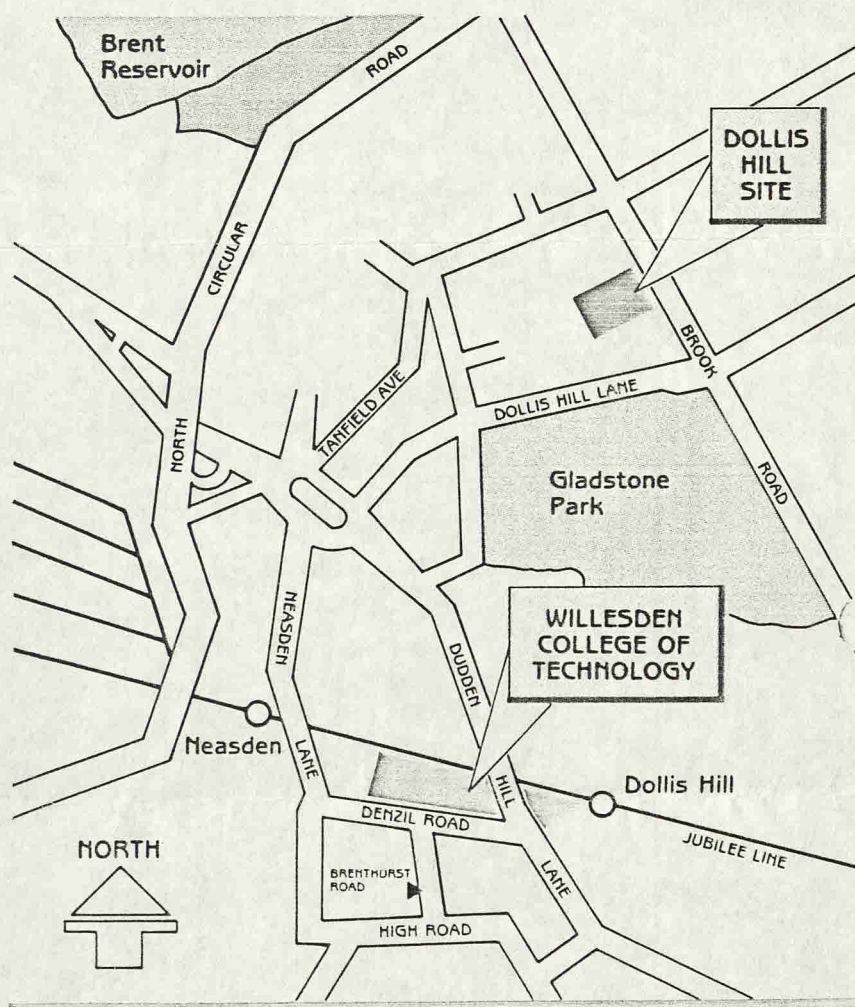
JUBILEE LINE: Dollis Hill or Neasden stations are a few minutes walk from the main College site.
