Courses

An Irish Dimension to Equal Opportunities

A course which looks at Irish Emigration to Britain, at the Experience of Irish people in Britain, at Discrimination and Disadvantage, at Perceptions of the Irish, and at Ethnicity, Race, Law. The course offers guidelines on how to practically incorporate an Irish dimension to into both equal opportunities policies and practices, and how to improve service delivery to Irish users/customers.

Working with Travellers

Irish Travellers have been coming to Britain for over 100 years, yet they remain a misunder-stood and marginalised group. Travellers experience a pervasive prejudice resulting in wide-spread discrimination and disadvantage. Travellers see themselves as an ethnic group in their own right, with their own language, culture, history etc. This course is aimed at those who work with, or come into contact with Travellers. Topics coverd include Perceptions of Travellers, Myths and Realities, Who are Travellers?, History and Origins, Social and Cultur e lifestyle, Guidelines for Good Practice and exercises on improving work with and service delivery to Travellers.

Housing and Homeless

Irish people are over-represented among the homeless in Britain and share the lowest rate of owner-occupation. Evidence points to high levels of discrimination and disadvantage among Irish emigrants in the housing market. This course aims to contextualise this experience and to increase understanding of why this happens. The course also looks at how individuals and organisations can practically include/improve anti-discriminatory practice.
