LEITRIM ASSOCIATION IN LONDON. MINUTES FROM MEETING OF 14TH APRIL 1980.

A meeting of the committee of the Leitrim Association in London took place at the Irish Centre on Monday 14th April 1980. Present were Jim Fox, M Winters, Adrian Fleming, T Maguire, Nora McGreal, Fr Butler, John McGarry and Michael Mulvannerty.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and accepted.

Barkers Penhouse suite requested payment of outstanding amount in the sum of £2045.00 due in payment for the Annual dinner dance. It was agreed that this should be attended to immediately as interest would have to be paid if delay occurred.

There was no treasurer's report. An amount of ~~£257.00~~ ^{£375.98} was realised from the St Patrick's eve social. Michael Mulvannerty agreed to accept the office of treasurer after a month. It was agreed to hand in the pass book and realise interest accumulated over the last two years. Michael Winters was to get the land bond from the AEB bank and the holders name was to be sent to the Premium Bond authorities.

James Flanagan was to be contacted to see if he would organise a Leitrim team for the inter county quiz.

THE BACON & CABBAGE DINNER. A list should be drawn up of all known Leitrim people and a membership card and a circular should be sent to them. It was agreed that an advertisement be sent to the Leitrim Observer and the Irish Post. A notice should also be sent to the Peter Kennedy column. The size of the advert to be a 1" double column. And a photograph and the account of the Annual General Meeting to be sent to the Observer and the Irish Post.

The raffle was to be a £1 whip round with £50 cash prizes. It was agreed that a sum of £15.00 be presented to the children who entertained on St Patrick's eve and it was also agreed that a sum of £15.00 be made to Tommy Maguire for the children.

Following a query it was stated that nothing had been heard from Peter Tierney re the Federation of Leitrim Associations. Luton Leitrim Association expressed a wish to be associated with Leitrim events in London...and vice versa. It was agreed that a sum of £5.00 be given to Fr Butler as a Mass stipend for the Mass for deceased members on the occasion of the Annual General Meeting.
