(a) Waterford's New Mattor: Alderman Richard Jones was elected Mayor of Waterford for the year 1959 - 1960. The election had a unique result in that the first Avoting was as follows (F.F.) 5 votes Cllr. John Griffin, N.T. (Lab.: 5 votes

The names of the three candidates were then placed in a hat when it was agreed that the first name drawn was to be the name of the candidate Cllr. (d) Discontinuance of the Fishguard - Waterford Las enger Service

The following is an extract from a letter received from the Department of Industry of Industry and Commerce of the Irish Government by the Hon Secretary in reply to the Association's OFFICIAL protest:

"Regarding the discontinuance of the Fishguard/Waterford passenger service, it is understood that the decision of British Railways to terminate this service was taken in the light of the continuing heavy losses of the service and following discussions with with the local interests concerned. hilst the Minister has no statutory function in te matter he has urged on British Reilways the importance of ensuring that adequate provision will be made on the Fishguard/Rosslare route to cater for all passengers and accompanied motor cars diverted from the Fishguard route.

British Railways have assured him that they expect no insuperable difficulties in catering for the diverted traffic on the Rosslare/Fishguard service."
