Dear Mr. Allighan,

I have been instructed to inform you that at the meeting of the Provisional Council held last Thursday, June 8th, it was unanimously decided that members of the Council be asked to make a further contribution to the League's funds. This is the second request for contributions from Council members and has been necessitated by the meagre response to the appeal launched early in May and addressed to a large number of people regarded as sympathetic to the aims of our Organisation.

Many of these people may yet be persuaded by personal approach to subscribe, but meanwhile the League is in urgent need of finance to meet outstanding obligations and current expenses. It is felt that Council members who were unable to attend last Thursday's meeting will agree with the view that every effort should be made to avoid the closing of our office and to that end will be prepared to make a financial sacrifice, according to their means, in the interests of the League.

A standing Committee, consisting of Mrs. Fintan Murphy; Mr.L. Martin; Mr. T. Sheehy (Hon Sec of the Stamford Hill Branch); Dr.E.P. Carey; Mr.P. Fitzgerald; the Organising Secretary and the Hon. Sec of the Council has been appointed to consider ways and means of raising funds and solving the League's financial difficulties. Other members of the Council are asked kindly to submit any ideas they may have on the subject.
