Your name has been recommended to us by Mr. W.J. Hearn as one who is sympathetic to the ideal of a United Ireland and would be willing to co-operate with the Anti-Partition of Ireland League in its endeavour to inform public opinion in Britain in favour of the abolition of Partition.

I enclose herewith a statement of the aims and objects of the Anti-Partition of Ireland League and a membership form which gives you full particulars.

An effort is being made to organise a branch of the League in Hampstead district and I am writing to ask you whether you would be willing to support it. We have already a number of members in the district and the names of numerous potential supporters. Before a branch can be formed, however, it is necessary, to find one or two active supporters who would be willing to devote a little of their leisure time to League activities.
