Dear Sir,

For a considerable period I have been interested in any movements formed with the purpose of ending the present state of affairs in Ireland, and have received publicity material from Mr. Noel Hartnett, the manager of the Northern Ireland Publicity Service since that organisation was instituted.

I attended the first meeting at the Friends' House, Euston Rd. Later I read in the Catholic Press that branches were to be organised in various parts of London, including my own area.

Little seems to have come to my notice in my own district, so I am writing in order that you will forward me enrolment form to complete. I should be grateful if you would send me a batch of these forms, as several I have spoken to on the subject have displayed some interest in your movement.

There may be some literature regarding the movement that I could use. There is a strong Catholic population here, and I understand a meeting has recently been conducted in the locality by the I.R.A.
