

I have delayed writing to you in order that I could complete the full arrangements for the Conference here in London on next Sunday, March 26th. The matter has been settled with the other branches and we now expect you to lunch with us at 1.30 p.m. at the Russell Hotel, Russell Sq., W.C.1. which is only a few minutes from Euston and Kings Cross Stations. We have booked a room in the Hotel for the afternoon and after lunch the delegates will adjourn for the meeting.

I agree with you that there is an urgent necessity to link up all the towns of Great Britain in the Anti-Partition movement and even if there is no time for anything but an exchange of views much good will have still been done and the Conference will have made clearer the future of the Anti-Partition movement.

Everyone expects to have a holiday time around Easter and may not like the idea of spending the Sunday at business.
