Dear Mr. O'Beirne,

Thank you for your letter of May 12th. I sent along to Beresford quite a lot of material for his article on Partition. I hope that he gets it safely. I should be very glad to receive a marked copy of Varsity when the article duly appears. I had a letter from Craig during the week which he has probably told you about. I am writing to him today in regard to the question of deferring any meeting until next term which I think is a wise course as students are very busy this term with examinations. If Beresford publishes his article on Partition, it may easily provoke a reply from Brooke or McQuitty in which case the question of Anti-Partition may be kept before the students until the end of this term. I hope to be able to go up to Cambridge again after May 28th and before June 10th.
