I have to thank you for your letter of February the 7th., and would have replied earlier, but as I was desirous of giving my executive an opportunity of discussing the suggested conference, I delayed replying until they had met.

You might let me have your observations. I would be glad also to have your views as to the number of officers from each area.

I note with pleasure that Councillor Lee of Manchester supports the idea. If you have his address I would be obliged if you will send it on.
