Dear Mr. Hickey. I enclose herewith statements showing payments made to Organisers to date. out of the sum of £24 remitted to me since May 19th. Expense Sheets covering part of the period have been already sent you, and I now enclose further Sheets covering remainder of the period up to, and including this week end. From the statement you will observe that the balance on hand at June 30th (including payments for that week) amounts to £1. 14. 4½ a further cheque will therefore be necessary. I understand from Mr. Moran; that he intended to travel to London last week end for a conversation with you, on various matters. I think this is the best method of dealing with any matters that may arise, and requires attention. Doubtless he will discuss the advisability of holding a big demonstration here in the near future, to arrange this we were hampered for want of funds. the deposit on any of the big Halls would be at least £10. and thus

there is the Printing, I think to organise effectively we should have the balance of the Money that was voted by Dublin here, and placed in Bank where we could call on it at any time, without bothering you. Personally I am not at all satisfied with the Chieffaring methods adopted to men like myself who first drew the attention of the people here to the evils of Partition, by cultivating public opinion to the necessity of removing the Boeder. It would be a great pity if our activities would have to cease through what I have referred to, and which is giving me serious thought. I trust you will give this consideration.
