Dear Mr. Early,

Your letter of July 12 contains a fully satisfactory solution of the problem we have been discussing and, after consultation with you fellow Hon. Treasurer, I have pleasure in forwarding herewith a cheque for £24 as a two months' instalment of Tomas Moran's salary. I agree that an essential part of an Organiser's work is the arranging of public meetings and that any efforts in this direction are seriously handicapped by lack of funds. As you will appreciate, however, it is necessary, in order to safeguard the Organiser's position that a Regional Executive should guarantee to refund any amount advanced from the National account for any purpose other than that for which the £100 grant was intended. The implementing of this guarantee will, of course, give rise to no difficulty when meetings cover their expenses, and I trust that Liverpool's experience in this respect will be more favourable than ours of last March.

I shall be writing to Tomas Moran in the course of a few days. Meanwhile, I am forwarding you for his file a copy of the letter I recently sent to the General Secretary of the A.O.H. together with a copy of the reply I received and also the letter kindly lent to me by Tomas Moran.
